Since July 2002, Dr. Bates Gill has held the Freeman Chair in China Studies at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington, D.C. He previously served as a Senior Fellow in Foreign Policy Studies and inaugural Director of the Center for Northeast Asian Policy Studies at the Brookings Institution. He has also directed East Asia programs at the Center for Non-proliferation Studies at the Monterey Institute, Monterey, California and at the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, and formerly held the Fei Yiming Chair in Comparative Politics at the Johns Hopkins University Center for Chinese and American Studies, Nanjing, China.

A specialist in East Asian foreign policy and politics, his research focuses primarily on Northeast Asian political, foreign policy, and social issues, especially with regard to China. His current projects focus on U.S.-China-Europe relations, on China's growing influence in Asian regional affairs, and on China's challenging domestic policy agenda.

He is the author, co-author, or co-editor of six books, including, *Rising Star: China's New Security Diplomacy* (Brookings, forthcoming in 2007), as well as *China: The Balance Sheet: What the World Needs to Know Now About the Emerging Superpower* (PublicAffairs, 2006), *Weathering the Storm: Taiwan, Its Neighbors, and the Asian Financial Crisis* (Brookings, 2000), *Chinese Arms Acquisitions from Abroad* (Oxford, 1994), *Arms Trade Transparency in Southeast Asia* (Oxford, 1996), and *Chinese Arms Transfers* (Praeger, 1991).

Dr. Gill received his Ph.D. in Foreign Affairs in 1991 from the Woodrow Wilson Department of Government and Foreign Affairs, University of Virginia.
